

In response, we spent several hundred additional hours putting together the Transformation conference to address this problem. We asked the question, "what are the five or six foundational things that Father God wants in all of our lives that will cause us to have that intimate and satisfying relationship with Him?" Jesus said, "I came that you might have life, and have it abundantly." How do we appropriate that life ... and with abundance? That is the thrust of the Transformation conference.

Each time, before we do either a Restoration or a Transformation conference, we spend a week or two prayerfully reviewing the material in light of those that will be attending. We do not look at a conference as a series of doctrinal lectures to convince folks to do better in their Christian lives. A conference is a time to examine our hearts before the Lord and give Him an opportunity to speak to us, minister to us and to change us into His likeness. In each conference, we see ourselves as transaction agents; our purpose in ministry is to assist the saints to join their hearts to the heart of Father God. Then we get out of the way so He can do His work. We know that any eternally significant ministry is done only by Him.

Transformation

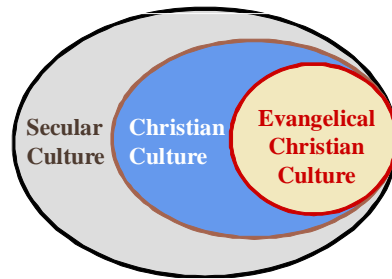
Change brought about by a walk of obedience - changing us into the likeness of Jesus Christ.

From the beginning, in the Garden of Eden, the eternal purpose of God was to change us into His image. With the fall of Adam and Eve, that purpose did not change, it just became more difficult.

We see today in the secular culture a large percentage of peoples' lives destroyed by:

Fear/Anxiety/Stress, Divorce, Abuse, Trauma, Illness, Depression, Broken Hearts, Backbiting, Dissension, Bitterness, Envy, Accusation, Occultism, Strife, Envy, Jealousy, Pornography, Lack of Joy and Peace . . .

In this regard the Christian community and the Evangelical Christian community is virtually indistinguishable from the secular society! The percentages are almost exactly the same. Clearly change is required.



Our ministry is all about change: it emphasizes the foundations of the Christian walk, consisting of the twin tasks of restoration and transformation:

- 1) **Restoration** - our being changed by removing the enemy's kingdom from our lives and
- 2) **Transformation** - our being changed into the likeness of Jesus Christ by a walk of obedience.

Periodically we do conferences in various parts of the United States - some larger, formal conferences and some smaller, informal conferences held in a person's living room. Out of these conferences we have developed a set of CDs and DVDs on Restoration and Transformation. We began with Restoration, spending hundreds of hours to create a simple, linear presentation making extensive use of several hundred graphic illustrations to make the material clear to the attendee. While we recognize there are many styles of learning, we also recognize that we are often presenting to an MTV generation used to sound bytes and visual images.

Over the years, during the breaks or after the conferences we often heard, "We have been to this ministry's conference and that ministry's conference (sometimes several times) and we are doing what is suggested --- but it just isn't working for me."

As we investigated these cases, it became clear that many of the saints had serious holes in their Christian foundation, and in some instances, no foundation at all! The problem often was not a lack of a doctrinal foundation but instead a serious lack of a relational foundation - they were having problems relating to Father God, to themselves and to others... broken hearts abounded!
