Remember: It is all based on

Begin with prayer.
Break the power of the Strongman, Accusation.
Deal with each of the underlings.
Then go back and cast out the Strongman, Accusation.
If necessary speak a creative miracle into being.

Underlings

Accusation towards God / Self/Others

- **Father God** - I take *responsibility* for the spirit of XX in my generation and all previous generations on both my mother's and my father's side all the way back to Adam.
 - I *repent* of and *renounce* the spirit of XX.
 - I ask *forgiveness* for allowing XX in my life and cooperating with it.
 - I ask now that the curse be broken.
- In the Name of Jesus of Nazareth, by the power of the Holy Spirit -
 - I take *authority* over you, spirit of XX.
 - I *break your power* spirit of XX and *cancel* your assignment.
 - I *cast you out* spirit of XX and *consign* you to the dry places.
- Father God, *heal* the place where the spirit of XX has been and *fill* that place with Yourself . . .

Spirits of Envy and Jealousy

Envy, jealousy, and covetousness will take your eyes off God and put them on a person, a place or a thing. That is idolatry! God will not share us with any false gods or idols. Whatever you worship will become your god and, in His jealousy. God will release you to your own devices without any protection whatsoever. If an idol becomes your god, then that god will have to take care of you. That's the danger of idolatry. It's not a good trade-off.

What does the Bible say about it?

Proverbs 14:30; Job 5:2; Proverbs 27:4; Romans 1:28-31; Mark 7:20-23; Galatians 5:19-21

What is Envy and Jealousy? Envy is a feeling of discontentment or ill will because of another's advantage, possessions or blessings. Jealousy is being very careful of or guarding something, not tolerating rivals. Making an icon out of a material object, person, place or thing.

God's Jealousy. God's jealousy is righteous, zealous; He protects his children. (1 Kings 14:22). He wants exclusive fellowship and will not share us with false gods (Ezekiel 8:3). When we have an idol, God, in his jealousy, will pull away and let that idol protect you - not a good trade-off!

We, as parents, can have a godly zealousness (2 Corinthians 11:2) for our children, but our zealousness can also be controlling and destructive.

Covetousness. Covetousness is to long for wrongly, with greed or avarice (Luke 12:15, Deuteronomy 5:21). Godliness with contentment, however, is great gain (1 Timothy 6:5, Matthew 6:33)! Be content with what you have (Hebrews 13:5)!

Nature of Envy and Jealousy. It has you comparing yourself to other people. You can't win because there will always be someone richer, smarter, etc. It makes others into Idols - "If I can only be like so and so." (Acts 10:34, Psalms 37:1, Proverbs, 3:31; 24:1). It is not trusting God's timing, and keeps you from being content with what you have. Other people's envy can steal your joy! The enemy's goal is to separate and divide and to keep you out of

the body of Christ. He wants to destroy relationships, families, marriages. Listening to envy and jealousy produces STRIFE; not listening to it produces PEACE! (James 3:16; Hebrews 13:5; Luke 12:15; Galatians 5:25-26)

Roots of Envy and Jealousy

Pride - Example of Haman and Mordecai

Rebellion - Example of Korah and Moses

Bitterness - Example of Saul and David, Joseph and his brothers

Control - Example of Sarah and Hagar

Scorn is jealousy to a degree where there's no reconciliation. (Proverbs 6:34-35) It is the level where wars are started, feuds, retaliation, violence, abuse, stalking.

Envy and Jealousy in the Marriage

Consider the myth of a love/hate relationship - love and hate can't exist together, it could not have been real love it was just a counterfeit affection (Song of Solomon 8:6). It leads to possessiveness, control, a princess in a tower - this is not the fruit of love. Also consider the curse of barrenness from real or imagined infidelity, opening the door to jealousy (Numbers 5:11)

Ministering against Envy and Jealousy

It all begins with Relationship and then Recognition coming from Discernment. The teaching and ministry must focus on God; He must remain the source of our desires, not what others have or don't have. God will not bless us in our sins, but when we fall out of agreement, hate it, take responsibility for it in our generations, then its power can be broken. There must be true repenting and forgiveness. See the Ministry Resource on the back of this sheet. Also consider the case study in "A More Excellent Way" of the lady healed of osteoporosis.

The E & J Worksheet



Begin with prayer. Give God permission to speak to your heart. Seek His guidance as you go down through the list. When you have a witness of your inner spirit that a particular item is something God would have you deal with, make a mark in the left circle. Then use the Prayer resource on the back page (same as the "Blue Card") to deal with the spirit. When you have dealt with it, make a mark in the right circle. Go through the list as often as necessary to come free, as the Holy Spirit leads you.
